#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

December 1, 1977

To the Members of the Rochester Society of Security Analysts, Inc.:

Fiscal year 1977 proved to be a year in which our society and the national organization began to operate under our unified self-regulatory program. Although our local society had no cases brought against any members, the national society was presented over two hundred cases to investigate. As the year drew to a close, one conviction had been reached, while a number of other cases were still under study.

Dues for the fiscal year remained level with the prior year, both as far as the local society was concerned and the national organization. It is hoped that no increase will be needed for the next several years, as your Board of Directors feels that higher dues prompt some members to drop out of the organization.

We had a very successful program of luncheons this year with fourteen meetings held. Average attendance exceeded forty, due to the large turnout for the Eastman Kodak and Sybron luncheons. For the year, the luncheon program ran at a small deficit of \$218, a figure considered quite satisfactory by your Board of Directors.

Statistics concerning the luncheon meetings as well as financial statements for the full fiscal year are enclosed as part of this report.
